Dale Schultz in Dickeyville and Cuba City on Friday, January 22

Senator Dale Schultz will make stops in Dickeyville and Cuba City on Friday, January 22. Dale welcomes all community members to join him at stops during the day, including at listening sessions he's holding where he will be available to discuss any issues or concerns.

In Dickeyville, Dale will start the day with a listening session from 8:30 to 9:15 a.m. in Room A of the Dickeyville Community Center, 500 East Avenue. The listening session is open to the public to discuss any issue.

From 10:15 to 10:45, Dale will be at Hauber's Processing, operated by Mick, John and Bob Hauber, 125 N. Main Street. From 11:00 to 11:30, Dale will be at Dickeyville Feed & Seed, operated by Len Timmerman at 220 North Ave.

Community members are also welcome to join Dale over a Dutch treat lunch at Katina's Kitchen from 11:45 to 12:45. The restaurant, at 205 W. Main Street in Dickeyville is owned and operated by Katina Haefele. While no reservation is needed, those wanting to sit with Dale should try to arrive by 11:45.

In Cuba City, Dale will be at PTC Machining from 1:15 to 2:00. Dale will be thanking PTC owner Tim Nolan for the jobs he is providing that help support families and the community. Dale will be asking Nolan about the impacts on manufacturing in Wisconsin resulting from legislation such as a proposed global warming bill. PTC is at 1121 S. Cody Street.

Senator Schultz will be at Cuba City High School from 2:15 to 3:00 to celebrate Project Lead the Way with students of Mr. Guy Kopp. Through the PLTW program, Cuba City and other leading school districts encourage boys and girls to consider academic and career directions in science, technology, engineering and math, fields essential to America's economic well-being.

From 3:15 to 4:00, Schultz will meet with Russ Stratten, President of Stratten Charters at 320 E. Jean Street in the Cuba City Industrial Park. A plan to limit engine idling to five minutes and other vehicle, fuel and emission policies in the global warming bill will be discussed.

Dale will end the day with a community listening session from 4:15 to 5:00 in the Cuba City Public Library, 108 N. Main Street. The session will be open to all community members to discuss any issue. Dale will also talk with library director Judith Kaiser about the essential services libraries are providing during the economic recession such as internet access to find a job or start a small business.
