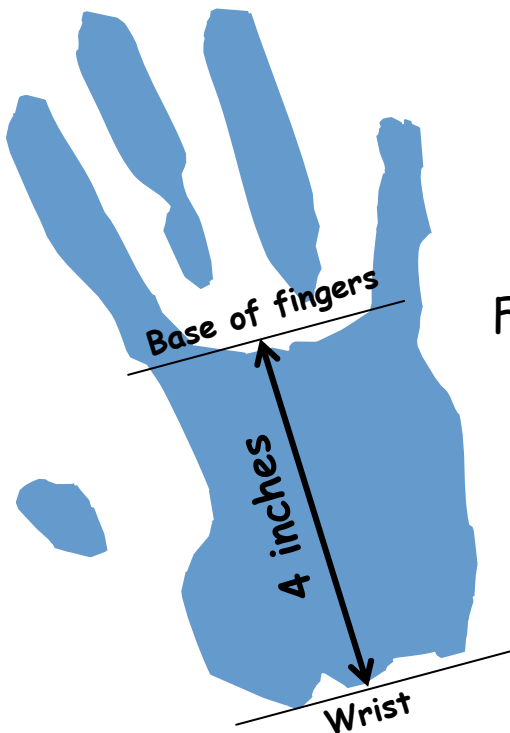


We have a recurring problem that we're trying to get a handle on, and we need your...



Fortunately, it's a small thing that can be solved as easily as 1—2—3—4 using:

- 1—your hand as a 4-inch guide
- 2—removable tape
- 3—rubber bands, and
- 4—item size-matching

What we are trying to remedy is further damage to library materials.

This can be prevented by using the 1—4 formula.

- 1—Limit the maximum height of bundled items to approximately 4 inches — just compare the stack to the distance between the base of your fingers and your wrist.
- 2—Use REMOVABLE TAPE (that still has its 'stick') to attach the routing slip to the top item. (Save regular tape for use on cardboard boxes.)
- 3—Wrap rubber bands around the stack both vertically and horizontally — tape followed by rubber bands will keep the routing slip from getting lost.
- 4—Item size-matching is a reminder to group items with similar height/width proportions, and **avoid pyramid groupings** (clumsy bundles of items with noticeably dissimilar height/width proportions. (You'll know them when you see them!))
